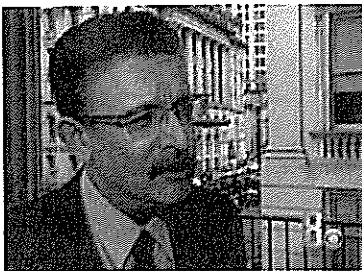

**School Board Takes Closer Look at Mr. Nadelstern**

The final push is underway as Clark County school trustees close in on making a decision on superintendent. The two finalists are acting Clark County Superintendent Dr. Walt Ruffes and New York City education official Eric Nadelstern.

Today, the Clark County school trustees are investigating how both candidates do business in their own school systems. Reporter Brian Allen is in New York City where a delegation is taking a look at Eric Nadelstern's schools.

Eric Nadelstern is New York City's superintendent for new school development. Clark County trustees Terri Janison, Larry Mason and Mary Beth Scow are in New York to see for themselves if Nadelstern has what it takes to run the Clark County School District.

The trustees began their day with a breakfast briefing at their midtown Manhattan hotel; each wants specifics about Eric Nadelstern, each wants to see if he is as good as he says he is. Nadelstern prides himself on an "outside the box" approach to education. The trustees toured a high school in Queens, which offers college-level classes to students who are learning English as a second language.
